A Message from Mars

³¹ To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. ³² Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

--John 8:31-32

To say that we have a great deal going on in the world today is a huge understatement. The coronavirus has created a situation where people across the globe are trying to find the best way to stay safe physically, mentally, and financially. Most people would say facing a pandemic creates enough uncertainty to push us to our limits, but it doesn't end there. Our country is also dealing with unrest as people wrestle with racial inequality. Those of us in the western United States are enduring a historic fire season, while people in the eastern part of the country are experiencing a historic hurricane season. To top it all off, we face an important presidential election that is not bringing out the best in people.

Just one of these big picture events would be difficult to handle, yet we have all of them at once – and we have an even bigger problem: misinformation. Like many of you, I'm spending big chunks of time in cyberspace. I have been shocked, appalled, and angered by the amount of misinformation I have encountered there.

As Christians, we are a people of the truth. As such, we must guard against believing and/or spreading misinformation. Just because something appears on our computer screens does not make it true. We must do our research – dig deeper, check sources, and read further. We owe it to ourselves, to one another, to our world, and to future generations to educate ourselves and to determine the truth. The truth is the truth, whether we like it or not.

Jesus said, "Then you will know the truth, and the truth shall set you free."

The truth is that, beyond all the doom-and-gloom headlines, we can find all kinds of good news. For instance, the Church of the Warm Heart is alive and well – not just surviving but thriving. We have almost as much happening virtually as we did when we were meeting in person. Here are just a few of the highpoints:

- In mid-September, we had a fantastic drive-through kickoff event for our ministry year. It was so nice to see the smiling faces of those who were able to turn out for that!
- Our online congregation today is significantly larger than our combined in-person/online congregation of the past ever was. God is blessing us as we strive to continue to reach people in His name.
- Attendance at our Tuesday afternoon Bible study which is, of course, now available 24 hours a day, seven days a week on our website, Facebook page, and YouTube has also grown dramatically.
- While we're not there yet, we believe that when our denomination reaches Phase 3 of the reopening plan, we will be able to resume off-site small group meetings. I am pleased to report that August was our second largest month of giving in 2020, and we were able to lower our deficit by almost \$11,000. After August in 2019, we were at a negative of \$24,856. Even though we are spending less this year, we are receiving less tithes and offerings. Doing an analysis of our financial year to date, we can predict what we would need to do in the next four months to reach a zero-deficit situation. Let me be the first to admit that there is nothing average about what we are currently experiencing. But based strictly on averages, if we maintain expenses for the next four months and our giving matches 2019, we will finish the year at minus \$1,066.

Historically, our congregation has had high giving totals in December. Hopefully, that will be the case this year, too! But due to the uncertainty of what we are facing, we need to be aware of where we stand. I am asking each of you to pray about our financial situation, and give extra if you can. I choose to remain optimistic, knowing our congregation's generosity and support of our ongoing ministries. As Pastor John likes to say, we have all the money we need! It's just still in your pockets.

THE BOOK NOOK

The UMW Reading Program books are organized into five categories: Spiritual Growth, Social Action, Education for Mission, Nurturing for Community and Leadership Development. Our local UMW chapter buys one from each category every year and makes them available to everyone. You will find recent books on the kiosk outside the kitchen in the Family Life Center; older books are in a bookcase in Room 1. All of these are available to any interested reader when we can gather in the church building. A simple checkout system is all that is required. In the meantime, most of the books are also available from the public library.

Included in the list each year are a few books that are also appropriate for children. One picture book chosen for 2020 is *Midnight Teacher: Lilly Ann Grandson and Her School.* Now that this unusual school year has started, young readers might be interested in the unusual school experiences of children in the past. Lilly Ann was born into slavery around 1821 and was a house slave from the time she was four years old. Her master's children would often include her in their game of playing school when they were out of ear-shot of the adults. Through these games, Lilly Ann learned to read and began teaching others, always in secret. As an adult, she held secret Midnight School for others in slavery, always in danger of being found out.

This powerful and beautifully illustrated drama of courage in the face of wrong demonstrates to our children the power of education, the gift of literacy, and the triumph of courage.
