A Message from Mars

It seems as if COVID-19 is going to be our unwanted companion for quite some time. That fact is requiring all of us to make many changes, and I've even changed my salutations on my messages to you! In the past, I have ended my correspondence with "Grace and Peace." During this time of great uncertainty, I have begun to use "Grace and Peace and Calm and Wisdom and Hope." I thought you might like to know why.

⁸ For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— ⁹ not by works, so that no one can boast.

Ephesians 2:8-9 (New International Version)

Grace means gift. God's grace is God's gift to us. We always need grace for ourselves and to give to others, but it is particularly important during these troubled times.

²⁷ Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

John 14:27 (New International Version)

Jesus gives us His peace, but that does not mean we will have an absence of trouble. Going through difficulty can make us into better people. The word *peace* in English just cannot capture the full meaning of *shalom* in Hebrew thought. Shalom means everything that makes for your greatest good. And everything means everything!

³³ "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

John 16:33 (New International Version)

Jesus offers us calm amid the storm. Jesus said he had overcome the world. I believe Him. I don't know what the future holds, but I know who holds the future.

⁵ If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you.

James 1:5 (New International Version)

We do not have to depend on our own wisdom. For those who love God, He promises His wisdom.

⁵⁰ I declare to you, brothers and sisters, that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable. ⁵¹ Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed— ⁵² in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. ⁵³ For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality. ⁵⁴ When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory."[a]

55 "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"[b]

⁵⁶ The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. 57 But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

1 Corinthians: 15:50-57 (New International Version)

Even in the face of death, we have hope. We are a Resurrection people. That is, by definition, what makes us Christian.

With these, we will get through this pandemic together. We will be changed, but we will be better on the other side.

God heard the boy crying and the angel called to Hagar from heaven and said to her, "What is the matter, Hagar? Do not be afraid; God has heard the boy crying as he lies there. Lift the boy up and take him by the hand, for I will make him into a great nation." Then God opened her eyes and she saw a well of water. So she went and filled the skin with water and gave the boy a drink. God was with the boy as he grew up.

Greetings church family! I hope you are well and have been able to experience moments of joy during this time of uncertainty. I pray that you have felt the presence of God through daily miracles- such as the flowers blooming, neighbors helping neighbors or possibly in the quiet moments of reflection. The world is transforming all around us; yet, for many it may feel like we've wandered into the wilderness during this time of physical isolation.

Recently, we studied Hagar during our Monday night Slightly Bad Girls of the Bible class. In the story, Hagar was sent away into the desert with very few provisions to care for her son and for herself. As she traversed the arid terrain, she became despondent and lost all hope. Her son was on the brink of death. God heard his cries and then revealed life-saving water. In this story we see that:

God called Hagar by name (God calls us by name as well. He longs for a personal relationship)
God heard the boy crying (God hears our cries)
God revealed life-saving water (God knows our needs and provides. Jesus is our living water)
God made him into a great nation (blessings are quite often revealed through our brokenness)
God was with the boy (God is with us through all circumstances)

If you feel like you've entered the desert, I pray that God will reveal life-affirming resources that will sustain you. I pray that you will feel God's presence and experience peace.

To say that I am surprised and very thankful for the way we, as a church, have responded with our tithes and gifts even though we are not meeting would be an understatement. I talked last month about not having the opportunity to place our offering in the plates each Sunday. But some have changed to online giving and others are going "old school" and simply mailing their gifts to the church office. Either way works! Currently we find ourselves in a negative position of \$17,535. Comparing last year to now, we are almost in the same position. Giving is almost the same, and expenses are within a couple hundred dollars.

When we can meet once again, you will notice that some improvements have been made that could affect our finances. A new roof is being installed over the FLC as I write this. The \$55,000 cost has been covered by members of our congregation. What a blessing to not have to have a special campaign to pay for this capital outlay.

Unfortunately, due to the pandemic the youth mission trip to Puerto Rico has been rescheduled to next year. This delay is a huge disappointment, but now we have another year to plan a bigger and better trip. The proposed changes in the sanctuary have been delayed as well. Not cancelled--just delayed. Also, the General conference has been postponed until a later time.

We are learning to adapt to the present situation we face. Few of us had ever heard of ZOOM. Now most of our committee meetings, Bible studies and staff meetings are conducted this way. Some of us would never have given online but now it is a routine way to sustain our church. It is a blessing to be able to watch our Sunday services via the internet. I am so glad that we decided to use modern technology to reach out to our community this way. I am keenly aware that all of us are missing our fellow church friends. At least we can see Pastor John each Sunday to give us a small feeling of normalcy.

Things will return to the way it was, but until that is a reality, please join me and my family as we continue to support the ministry of our church. To make a gift online, please visit meridianumc.com and click the banner for GIVING and follow the prompts. You may also mail your check to the church office at 235 E. Pine Ave, Meridian, ID 83642. If you normally give cash, please consider dropping a check in the mail or even look at our online giving options. We also encourage you to continue to join us in worship each Sunday morning at 9:30 a.m. via a recording or at any other time. Steps have been taken to assist any member of the Church of the Warm Heart who needs help. If you need assistance contact the church. We Are Here for YOU. Please continue to pray for our church staff and our governmental leaders during these trying times.
